

NIT-Hamirpur student dies of 'drug overdose', one held with narcotics

Hamirpur (HP): A day after a first-year M.Tech student of the National Institute of Technology was found dead in his hostel room due to a suspected drug overdose, another NIT student was arrested Tuesday after charas was seized from his possession, police said. On Monday, the police had arrested four persons, including three NIT students and another pursuing BEd, for allegedly distributing 'Chitta', a form of adulterated heroin, on campus. They were booked under the NDPS Act. The police probing the death Tuesday arrested a B.Tech third-year student, a resident of UP, after 69.38g of charas was recovered from him. PTI

Rajnath in Tawang with troops on Dussehra, hails them for guarding frontier

DEFENCE MINISTER Rajnath Singh Tuesday performed 'Shastra Puja' in Arunachal Pradesh's Tawang and celebrated Dussehra with soldiers in the strategically key region close to the frontier with China. Singh, accompanied by Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande, also carried out a comprehensive review of India's military preparedness along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Arunachal Pradesh and lauded the troops for guarding the border with "unwavering commitment and unparalleled courage". "No amount of appreciation is enough for the way you are guarding the border in difficult circumstances. I want to tell you that the people are proud of you," he told the troops. In 1962, Tawang town was over-run by Chinese troops on October 24.

During an interaction with soldiers after visiting Bum-La and a number of other forward posts, Singh asserted there is no option but to bolster the country's security apparatus in view of the current global scenario. He said all efforts are being made to strengthen the nation's military prowess through indigenous production of defence equipment. "Earlier, we used to rely on imports to upgrade our military. But today, a number of major weapons and platforms are being manufactured within the country. Foreign companies are being encouraged to share their technology and produce the equipment in India with domestic industry. In 2014, the value of defence exports

was about Rs 1,000 crore, but today we are exporting defence equipment worth thousands of crores," he said. Singh's Dussehra celebrations with soldiers at a military base not far from the LAC comes at a time when India and China have been engaged in a bitter standoff in certain friction points in eastern Ladakh for over three years. Indian and Chinese troops were engaged in a clash along the LAC at Yangtse in the Tawang sector on December 9 last year. He visited the Tawang war memorial and laid a wreath and offered tributes to the soldiers who made the supreme sacrifice during the 1962 war with China.

The defence minister expressed gratitude to the soldiers for their "unyielding spirit, unwavering commitment and unparalleled courage" while guarding the borders. Singh has been performing "Shastra Puja" during Dussehra for the last several years, including during his tenure as the Union Home Minister in the previous NDA government. Singh cited India's success in the economic sphere as one of the reasons for the

country's growing global profile. But at the same time noted that if the armed forces hadn't guarded the country's border effectively, then its stature would not have risen.

Citing his recent tour of Italy, he recalled his visit to Montone memorial which has been built to honour the contribution of Naik Yaswant Ghadge and other Indian soldiers who fought in the Italian campaign to liberate Montone during the Second World War. He added that even Italian people pay their respects at the memorial. The defence ministry said Singh was briefed on the infrastructure development along the LAC, and the deployment of cutting-edge military equipment to enhance the operational efficiency of the troops.

India has maintained that its ties with China cannot be normal unless there is peace in border areas. The Army has significantly bolstered deployment of troops and weaponry along the nearly 3,500 km-long LAC, including in the Sikkim and Arunachal Pradesh sectors following the eastern Ladakh standoff.

JUSTICE CHANDRACHUD ON 'UNFINISHED LEGACY OF AMBEDKAR'
CJI: Remedying historical wrongs ought to be goal of any constitutional system

UNDERLINING THE role played by affirmative action in correcting "historical wrongs", Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud called for rejecting the arguments of "caste elites" that "just because affirmative action is being provided, structural issues of discrimination don't exist any more."

"Even the slightest success of affirmative action is used by the caste elites to dismiss the issues around caste inequalities. Arguments are advanced that just because affirmative action is being provided, structural issues of discrimination don't exist any more. Such binary narrations must be rejected," the CJI said while delivering the keynote address at the Sixth International Conference on Unfinished Legacy of Dr BR Ambedkar at Brandeis University in Massachusetts.

Addressing the event on October 22, he said, "Throughout history, marginalised social groups were subjected to horrendous wrongs, often stemming from prejudice, discrimination, and unequal power dynamics. From the brutal transatlantic slave trade that forcibly uprooted millions of Africans to the Native American displacement, to the caste inequalities in India affecting millions of backward castes, to the oppression of indigenous Adivasi communities, to the systemic oppression of women, LGBTQ+ individuals, and other minority communities, the annals of history are stained with instances of profound injustice."

CJI Chandrachud said, "Unfortunately, the legal system has often played a pivotal role in perpetuating historical wrongs against marginalised social groups." "Law as an institution was used to maintain existing power struc-

tures, and to institutionalise discrimination... Even when these laws have been eventually overturned or repealed, the legacy of their harm can persist for generations," he pointed out. "Remedying historical wrongs ought to be the goal of any constitutional system," he said, adding that "representation is only one way of achieving this."

He said that "affirmative action and representation were crucial components of constitutional foundations laid down in India" and that "Dr Ambedkar fought tooth and nail to get the provisions of affirmative actions incorporated into the Constitution". "He said since Independence, "affirmative action policies in India have offered crucial support to oppressed social groups by providing them with opportunities for education, employment, and representation that might otherwise be inaccessible due to deeply entrenched inequalities".

Citing data, he said the representation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes "has increased in government services under the various categories during the last seven decades". "As per available information, as on January 1, 1965, the representation of Scheduled Castes in Group A of government

services (top-level bureaucratic posts) was just 1.64%, which has increased to 13.21% as on January 1 2022. Likewise, while representation of Scheduled Tribes as on January 1, 1965 in Group A was 0.27%, it has increased to 6.01% as on January 1, 2022. This is the direct impact of the Constitution," said the CJI.

"... Reformation beyond representation entails ensuring that marginalised communities not only have a seat at the table, but also have a meaningful voice in the decision-making process." He said "the idea of representation through affirmative action must be facilitated by discourse on broader systemic issues such as unequal access to quality education". When more people from oppressed groups would gain education, their presence in institutions through affirmative action will rise. That is when the full potential of affirmative action would be seen." CJI Chandrachud said, "apart from affirmative action, the most important impact of Dr Ambedkar's formulation was Article 17, which abolishes untouchability, and was placed in the chapter on fundamental rights, along with the provisions of equality and non-discrimination..."

As state elections near, central govt shines brighter in BJP

MONTHS AHEAD of the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, ground reports from the poll-bound states indicate the continuing popularity of Prime Minister Narendra Modi even as the inherent tensions within the INDIA bloc come to the fore. However, while the BJP will draw solace from this - beyond how things turn out for the party in the coming elections - there are signs of some disquiet at the local level.

As the party seeks votes in the name of the BJP, with local satraps consciously sidelined, the cadre are talking of shrinking opportunities for them in power. Among those higher up the ladder, there are murmurs that the concentration of powers has shut them out of decision-making. BJP leaders question the phasing out of a robust second rung, and fear this will eventually tell on the party - particularly as this puts it apart from rivals. There is no lack of communication, with the BJP high command continuously interacting with state units over action plans and outreach programmes.

However, leaders say that many a time, this is a one-way exercise, with the central command taking decisions unilaterally, including on strategies in their area. This has coincided with the digitisation push, which has ended up taking intermediary leaders out of the picture. While earlier they built a network of give-and-take through projects and welfare schemes, systems can now be directly monitored by the Centre. Down the ranks, communication channels, too, are limited. *The Indian Express* had earlier reported how Union ministers and MPs fielded for the Madhya Pradesh Assembly elections got to know of their nomination only 48 hours before the announcement. Recently, supporters of former Jharkhand chief minister Raghubar Das barely concealed their surprise over his sudden transfer as governor to Odisha. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's assertion recently that ministers who have served multiple terms in the Rajya Sabha should contest the Lok Sabha elections has also set off a nervous guessing game. As the clock ticks towards 2024, a leader

hopes they will come to know in advance, so that they can nurture the constituency allotted to them. Some leaders point out that the Madhya Pradesh list with such big names, without any prior warning, meant that discontent spilled into the open. In Rajasthan, after initial hesitance, the central leadership went out of its way to oblige former chief minister Vasundhara Raje. Sources said a number of her supporters were accommodated in the second list after a survey showed the damage an angry Raje might cause. "The party did not want to repeat what happened in Himachal Pradesh and Karnataka," a party leader says, referring to the BJP's poll defeats in the two states where the state units were divided. In Madhya Pradesh, BJP has come around to accepting the importance of the "fatigue factor" over him lay at the heart of the anti-incumbency against the party government, and that sidelining him was the way around it. **FULL REPORT ON** www.indianexpress.com

3 die in stampede at Bihar pandal

THREE PERSONS including a 12-year-old boy were killed and about 10 people injured in a stampede at a Durga Puja pandal in Gopalganj Monday evening. Three persons have been referred to Gorakhpur hospitals while seven persons were being treated at Gopalganj hospitals. Locals said the incident took place around 8.30 pm at a pandal organised by the Raja Puja Dal samiti on Station Road under Town Police Station when devotees lined up to see a statue of goddess Durga. The incident occurred when the boy fell. Two women behind him leaned forward to save the boy and they fell too. With just one exit, a stampede ensued. While the child died on the spot, the women, who complained of breathlessness, passed away while on way to Sadar Hospital, Gopalganj. The deceased were identified as Ayush Kumar (12), son of one Dilip Ram from Sanah Mathia village, Urmila Devi (55) from Kuchaikot and Shanti Devi from Town Police Station area. Locals have blamed the incident on "poor crowd management". Govind Kumar, a Gopalganj resident said, "The place where the stampede took place has about a 20-foot narrow stretch of the Station Road. The pandal had about 25,000 people in its vicinity. Had the lock of an adjoining school not been opened to give passage to the crowd, the situation could have been worse. Gopalganj town pandals had estimated a crowd of 1.5 lakh Monday evening." Sonu Kumar, an eye witness, said crowd management could have been better. The administration restricted people's movement around puja pandals on Vijayadashmi Tuesday.
